on the work of Paulo Freire from March 1970 to October 1971

To the extent that the staff working group on Education begins to become more and more a real work team, through an experience of a real dialogue, it seems to me interesting to present a summary of my activities since February 1970 when I started them, until today. Based on them, it will be possible for me to propose in a clear way the specific field of my action, which does not mean, however, that such a field is an exclusive one for myself, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, that I cannot collaborate with my colleagues in their specific field of work.
